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

Directions

STEP 1

Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil over high heat. Cook pasta according to package directions; drain.

STEP 2

Meanwhile, whisk together vinegar, oil, and honey in a bowl. Season with salt and pepper. Add hot pasta, tomatoes, and mozzarella balls; toss gently to coat. Add basil and toss to combine. Serve chilled or at room temperature.

INGREDIENTS

- KOSHER SALT AND FRESHLY GROUND BLACK PEPPER
- /I LB. SHORT PASTA, SUCH AS PENNE RIGATE
- VIZ C. WHITE BALSAMIC VINEGAR
- VIA C. OLIVE OIL
- 12 TBSP. PURE HONEY
- I LB. GRAPE OR CHERRY TOMATOES, HALVED
- √8 OZ. PERLINE (PEARL-SIZE) MOZŽARELLA BALLS, DRAINED, OR 8 OVNCES FRESH MOZZARELLA, TORN
- 1/2 C. LOOSELY PACKED FRESH BASIL, TORN INTO LARGE PIECES


